Bodily Injury Overview

- For the first six months of 2009, there have been a total of 26 Cadets and Senior Members who have received bodily injuries while conducting CAP operations this year.



JAN – FEB 09

- A branch scratched cadet's eye
- Cadet injured left knee during PT
- Cadet became car sick
- Cadet had difficulty breathing
- Cadet fainted during meeting
- Cadet injured shoulder doing push-ups
- Cadet dizzy & leg cramps
- Cadet slipped on ice, injured back
- Cadet slipped on ice, twisted knee
- Cadet tripped on clothing exiting van
- Cadet sprained ankle dancing
- Three cadets sick during or after PT
- SM tripped, cut his face and fell on wrist
- SM slipped on ice in parking lot
- SM tripped on expansion joint at airport



MAR 09

- No bodily injuries reported



APR 09

- Cadet broke collarbone playing a game
- Cadet slipped on floor striking chin received stitches
- Cadet jumping fence fractured elbow...



MAY 09

- SM tripped on sidewalk between hangars; lacerated forehead
- SM cut finger; received stitches



JUN 09

- Wind blew AVGAS into a cadet face after removing nozzle from aircraft
- Cadet suffered allergic reaction during refueling
- SM lacerated foot getting off bunk bed
- Cadet lacerated face hitting headboard on bunk bed
- Cadet had allergic reaction to 8 insect bites
- Cadet fell on obstacle course and broke wrist



Prevention

- What can we do to prevent bodily injuries?
- Besides not jumping fences on “O” flights – what are your suggestions?
